LTSAE improves early identification of children with developmental delays and disabilities by promoting parent-engaged developmental monitoring and facilitating early action on concerns, so children and families can get the services and support they need. **LTSAE is a health education campaign that promotes:**

- The importance of tracking milestones and acting early on concerns;
- The availability of free checklists, children’s books, a mobile app, and other resources.
